1. What Your Gun Safe Protects: Most large gun safes are designed for the storage of long barreled firearms such as hunting rifles and competition shotguns. If there isn't a fire station within a mile, you might want to consider a safe at the top end of the <u>fire</u> <u>protection spectrum</u>. If you live or work in an urban area and fire isn't the biggest concern, you could probably be fine with a <u>30-minute fire safe</u>.

4. Location of Your Gun Safe: Where you position your safe within your living or working space means allowing sufficient room for it while it's closed, as well as clearance to open the doors and easily access the contents when you need them.
